Lead Sheet	Nobody Knows You When You're Down and Out (Jimmie Cox)	Blues Standard: Major and diminished 7 th chords. Recommended Styles: Arpeggiated root position chords; Jump Bass, Close position inversions; stride bass, keyboard style, jump bass + keyboard style. Playlist included.
Lead Sheet	Danny Boy (Londonderry Air) (Weatherly/Ireland)	(F Major) Seventh chords in inversions. Includes M7, m7, V7, full and half dim 7 chords. Slash chord notation. Playlist included.
Harmonization	Aura Lee (Love Me Tender) (Fodsick/Poulton) (V/IV, V/V, V/vi)	(Bb Major, 4/4, V7/IV, V7/V, V7/ii) Simple melody. Accompaniment options include blocked chords, jump bass, and two-handed accompaniment in keyboard style. Playlist included.
Repertoire	Sonata (Aria) in D Minor, L. 23 by Domenico Scarlatti	(D minor, 3/8) requires three types of Baroque ornamentation: the trill, the mordent, and the rolled chord. In general, Baroque ornaments begin on the downbeat.
Repertoire	The Little Would-be Man by Alexander Gretchaninov	(F Major, 3/4) Waltz in ternary ABA form. 2-voices in one hand, jump bass using 7 th chords.
Repertoire	By the Seaside, Op 63, No. 7 by J. L. Streabbog	(F Major, 4/4) Extended position arpeggios, pedaling.
Repertoire	Prelude in E Minor, Op. 28, No. 4 by Fryderyk Chopin	(E Minor, 2/2) Melody over chromatic chordal accompaniment. Comfortable octave span required. Some 4-note chords; 2:3 polyrhythm.

Repertoire	Prelude in C Minor, Op. 28, No. 20 by Fryderyk Chopin	(C Minor, 4/4) Requires large hand span, 4-note chords that require both top and inner-note voicing skill.
Repertoire	Prelude in F Major, BWV 927 by J. S. Bach	(F Major, 4/4) requires finger dexterity and a solid knowledge of chords and inversions. Suspensions, walking bass line, seventh chords.
Collaborative Piano	Old French Song by Pyotr Tchaikovsky	The piano accompaniment features two textures. In the 'A' section, notice the chorale-like 4-part texture. The 'B' section employs inversions of four-note chords in the right hand. Playlist included.
Collaborative Piano	Ich grolle nicht by Robert Schumann	A relaxed wrist and flexible hand are necessary to maintain the numerous chord repetitions in this song. Contains octaves, 4- note chords, inversions. Playlist included.
Collaborative Piano	Musetta's Waltz by Giocomo Puccini	This accompaniment requires facility playing a jump bass and comfort playing four-note and other extended position chords. Playlist included.
Hymn/Chorale	Let Us Break Bread Together (U.S. – Spiritual)	(Eb Major 4-part) This hymn gets its rich harmonic color from the many seventh chords and secondary dominants used.
Hymn/Chorale	O Little Town of Bethlehem (Christmas)	(G Major, 3-part) Chromaticism, secondary dominants.
Score Reading	Savior, Like a Shepherd Lead Us by Dorothy Ann Thrupp (SATB)	SATB - Christian hymn by <u>Dorothy Ann</u> <u>Thrupp</u>
